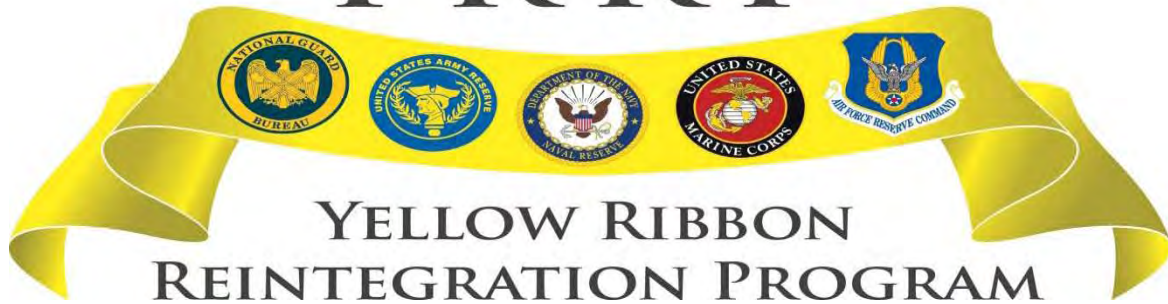

The Colorado National Guard's Department of Defense Yellow Ribbon Reintegration Programs goal is to provide nearly 5,000 Soldiers, Airmen and their families the tools necessary to ease the hardships of a deployment. Since 2004 Family Programs has been conducting post-deployment retreats for the service member and their family at the 90-day mark. They worked with the Veteran's Administration Hospital to provide the resources needed to achieve that goal. In 2008 this became a requirement and it was named the Yellow Ribbon Reintegration Program. Section 582 of the National Defense Authorization Act mandates each state to provide a reintegration program for returning service members and their families. Colorado took this one step further. We are providing pre-mobilization events for soldiers and their families at 90, 60 and 30 days prior to deployment. Service member participation is mandatory and is held during scheduled drill periods prior to the deployment. During the deployment, Family programs meet with your families on a monthly basis to support them through this difficult time. We also are able to offer our spouses a retreat midway through the deployment. This retreat teaches the spouses more coping skills while in a relaxing environment. Once the service member returns, our program offers 30, 60 and 90 day post-deployment events. Again, these events are required for our service members and offer the tools necessary for a successful reintegration.

The Yellow Ribbon program places special emphasis on the children and youth of the deployed service members. During every event there are special programs available for the youth to address their needs. We work very closely with Operation Military Kids to offer a fun and exciting program. We also offer a separate weekend retreat midway through the deployment just for the youth.

We have designed our program so that it can be applied to any military component. We have invited returning service members from the Air National Guard as well as the Army Reserves. For the first time we have joint events with the Air National Guard service members attending the reintegration retreat, a 60-day post-deployment event. Additionally we are working closely with the Army Reserves to have their returning Soldiers and families attend.

We are VERY fortunate to have received a \$1 million Congressional add-on for fiscal year 2010 due to the efforts of Major General Edwards. The addition of these funds have allowed us to provide the best Yellow Ribbon program possible. The funding has allowed us to provide an exceptional level and quality of service to over 3000 service members and their spouses. Our youth program has also provided training and support to more than 600 children. Due to the current deployment cycle Colorado is now facing, there are 20 events scheduled for the year 2010. With the return of over 700 soldiers this year and the projected deployment of over 800 soldiers in the next 12 months, the need for a robust Yellow Ribbon program is more important than ever.

SUBJECT: National Guard Bureau Policy and Implementation Guidance for the Department of Defense Yellow Ribbon Reintegration Program

1. REFERENCES:

2. PURPOSE: Authorized by the National Defense Authorization Act of 2008, the Department of Defense (DoD) Yellow Ribbon Reintegration Program (YRRP) will provide National Guard and Reserve Members and their Families with information, services, referral and proactive outreach opportunities throughout the entire deployment cycle: Pre-Deployment, Deployment, Demobilization and Post-Deployment-Reconstitution. It is the intent of the National Guard Bureau to establish a DoD YRRP that provides a continuum of

support and high standard of care for Army and Air National Guard members and their Families. Guidance contained herein outlines the specific policies, procedures and responsibilities required to implement the program.

3. POLICY:

a. A Joint National Guard DoD YRRP Management Office has been established within the National Guard Bureau, Office of the Joint Staff (NGB-J1-R). This office is responsible for management and oversight of the program and provides all policy and guidance in collaboration with the Directors of the Army and Air National Guard to the Adjutants General. This office will serve as the primary point of contact among the Office of the Secretary of Defense, the Army and Air National Guard Directorates and the Adjutants General.

b. DoD YRRP events and activities will be held for all National Guard members, and their Families, when they are called or ordered to active duty or full-time operational support, other than for training, for 90 consecutive days or more, or, in the case of the Air National Guard, 90 cumulative days or more during a fiscal year. At a minimum, events and activities will be provided in all phases of deployment, and conducted in a timely manner, in geographically centric locations and as often as possible to ensure maximum participation by National Guard members and their Families.

c. Attendance at DoD YRRP events is mandatory for National Guard personnel described in para 3b. The Army and Air National Guard will ensure that Soldiers and Airmen receive appropriate pay and allowances for their participation. The pay status of the Service member attending events will be determined by each respective Service. Adjutants General and Army and Air National Guard Commanders are urged to educate their personnel on DoD YRRP services and to encourage Family attendance at scheduled events.

d. When conducting DoD YRRP events and activities, commands should coordinate usage of other service support resources such as ESGR, Warrior Support, Family Programs, Directors of Psychological Health and Joint Forces Headquarters Sexual Assault Response Coordinators, as well as state and local departments and public and private organizations, as appropriate. Any National Guard hosted DoD YRRP event should be advertised as a DoD YRRP event versus a "National Guard" event to promote attendance from Service members from all components and their Families.

e. The Secretary of Defense has appointed an advisory board to analyze the DoD YRRP and report on areas of success and areas for necessary improvements. The Directors of the Army and Air National Guard, and an Adjutant General on a rotational basis, serve on this board. As we continue to work with the Department of Defense and Service Secretaries to gain additional fidelity on establishing a long-term effective program, we urge you to move forward with your DoD YRRP activities and events so that our Members can immediately benefit from this most vital program. We solicit your continued input as we

develop and adapt this program to reflect the needs of our National Guard members and their Families.

I. This guidance replaces all previous DoD YRRP guidance issued from the National Guard Bureau. All future DoD YRRP policy and funding guidance will be signed by the Chief, National Guard Bureau, the Directors of the Army and Air National Guard, and the Director of the Joint Staff in order to provide the States with uniform, jointly developed DoD YRRP policy and a single implementation plan.




6. **EFFECTIVE DATE:** This Guidance is effective immediately.

2. Effective 27 January 2010, this memorandum authorizes Army demobilization/REFRAD stations to include two (2) duty days for YRRP attendance activities for every thirty (30) days of annual leave/PDMRA earned by Reserve and National Guard to be incorporated in the Soldier's REFRAD date. Upon return of the Soldier from theater, the REFRAD date is calculated by adding regular leave, PDMRA and days for YRRP activities


3. Soldiers with an annual leave/PDMRA balance less than 30 days do not qualify. OCAR and NGB must provide Deputy Chief of Staff, G-1 their management controls to verify the Soldiers granted duty days for YRRP activities actually attend. OCAR and NGB will also provide their management procedures for the recoupment of active duty

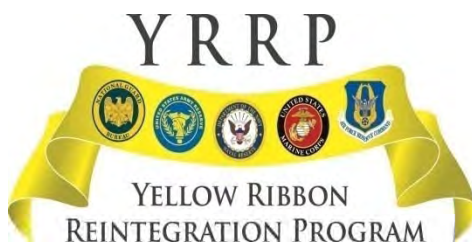
