Mike Speth's relationship with the DMVA began in 1979, shortly before his 18th birthday when he enlisted in the Colorado Army National Guard.

Initially starting out in the 140th Signal Company in Fort Collins, Speth soon moved to a medical unit before finishing college, attending officer candidate school, and earning a commission. Upon commissioning he was assigned to the 135th Aviation Battalion as a 2nd Lieutenant.

As a part-time soldier, Speth began working full time as a state employee with the precursor to the DMVA in 1994 in the environmental section of Buckley Space Force Base. A funding change saw Speth shift his career back to wearing a uniform. He accepted a Title-10 Active Guard Reserve Position in Arlington, Virginia where he put his environmental protection skills to use at the federal level.

Over the next 14 years, Speth would work in nearly every National Guard and Army environmental protection program in existence. He retired from military service in 2015.

"But I wasn't done yet," said Speth.

In 2015, Speth took a position as a state employee in the G9, Installations and Environmental Division, formerly CFMO, working on environmental compliance and energy programs.

In March, he began in a new DMVA position as the Sustainability and Environmental Management System Program Manager.

"A majority of my efforts involves understanding our facilities' energy and water systems with the objective to reduce consumption and improving our resiliency," Speth explained.

Speth went on to explain that the Army published a significant document for Climate Change Strategy just last year with many installation near and long-term goals. Thanks to the work Speth, and the rest of the G9, are doing many of those goals were ones that DMVA is already working on successfully.



"I love being outdoors, the Colorado culture, and I enjoy fishing with my father and sons. We have visited all but four of the US National Parks and expect to complete those in the next several years," Speth said.

One of those goals involves the modernization and transformation of fleets to Zero-Emission vehicles.

"You may have already noticed the Chevy Bolts in use on the front range as well as new Electric Vehicle Charging Equipment being installed at many of our facilities," Speth pointed out.

These changes will reduce operational costs and improve the environment by reducing carbon pollution.

Speth's home and hobby farm is in Loveland, where he and his wife have a small orchard of fruit trees and a large flock of chickens, ducks and turkeys. The two of them often travel domestically to discover and enjoy the very natural beauty that Speth has dedicated a career to protecting.

Mike Speth has served the state of Colorado, the country, and indeed the world for his entire life. The positive effects of his work will be felt by the Army, and humanity as whole, for generations to come.

"I've seen a lot of changes in Colorado over the years, including my time in the National Guard and Department of Military Affairs," concluded Speth. "It is my honor to serve and continue providing for opportunity and a better future for our Service Members, Veterans and Citizens."

State Legislature passes Long Bill: Here's what's coming to DMVA

Over the last 2 months, the State Legislature has undergone the arduous process of determining the state's budget. These discussions and committee hearings culminate in the passing of what is called "The Long Bill".

This process begins in the Joint Budget Committee (JBC). Made up of 3 Representatives and 3 Senators, the JBC hears items and requests from all departments of State government and then votes to accept or deny requests. From these committee hearings, the Long Bill is produced.

From there, the Long Bill is introduced on the floors of both the House and Senate.

It is on the floors of these two chambers that the General Assembly debates amendments to the Long Bill. Each chamber makes changes based on their members requests.

Once each chamber has debated and made their respective amendments, the JBC acts as a conference committee and votes, once again, to either approve or deny the General Assembly's changes.

The Long Bill passed officially on April 13th. The DMVA received significant resources this year compared to years past. To the right, you will see what changes are coming to the department starting July 1!
