This could involve installing ramps, accessible parking spaces, and elevators, as well as ensuring that doorways and hallways are wide enough to accommodate wheelchairs. The G9 works hard to ensure that all DMVA facilities are kept accessible.

Communication Accessibility: Making information and communication channels available to people with diverse needs. This might involve offering sign language interpretation services, providing documents in accessible formats (such as large print or Braille), and ensuring that public announcements are conveyed through multiple channels.

Service Accessibility: Ensuring that services and programs offered by the DMVA are available to all individuals, regardless of their abilities. This could involve providing assistance for completing forms, offering alternative

methods of communication (such as video calls for individuals with hearing impairments), and training staff members to be sensitive to diverse needs.

Laws such as the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) mandate that public and private entities ensure equal access for individuals with disabilities. State law, HB21-1110 makes it a state civil rights violation for a government agency to exclude people with disabilities from receiving services or benefits because of lack of accessibility.

Promoting Inclusivity: Accessibility standards play a pivotal role in fostering an inclusive environment. They demonstrate the DMVA's commitment to valuing and respecting the contributions and rights of every individual, regardless of their abilities.

Economic and Social Impact: By embracing accessibility standards, the DMVA contributes to a more inclusive society, thereby promoting economic growth and social progress. When barriers are removed, individuals with disabilities can more actively participate in the workforce, contribute to the economy, and engage in community activities.
