The day has finally arrived! UKG Workforce Dimensions Go-Live is here, and we are excited to introduce this new system to streamline our timekeeping and scheduling processes at the DMVA. As we transition into UKG, we want to ensure a smooth and successful implementation for all employees.

1: Log in and Check Your Accruals and Schedules:

To kickstart your journey with UKG, the first step is to log in to the system. Please take a moment to access Kronos and check your accruals, which include your leave balance. This information is crucial for planning your time off and ensuring accurate record-keeping.

The URL is https://soc-wfd.prd.mykronos.com. You should have an email from HR with your employee ID and temporary password. If you do not, please contact your supervisor.

Additionally, it's essential to review your schedules in UKG. Most personnel in the department will have their 40-hour schedules already loaded into the system. However, if you need to modify your work schedule, coordinate with your supervisor to make the necessary adjustments.

Upcoming Employee Awareness

- The DMVA now has a Virtual Suggestion Box! If you have any ideas on how the DMVA can be better, both internally and externally, please place a submission into the virtual suggestion box linked below:

- All permanent State classified and non-classified employees in the Executive Branch, including employees in the State Patrol classes hired prior to July 1, 2023 will receive a pay increase of five percent (5%).
- Starting July 1, employees will have the option of switching to biweekly pay.
- FAMLI program premium payments began on Jan. 1, 2023, and since that time, the State covered the full premium for State employees for the first half of this calendar year. With the passage of Senate Bill 23-234 on April 12, employees must now pay their share of the FAMLI premium at 0.45% as a payroll deduction beginning July 1, 2023.
- Starting July 1, all employees will receive mailed pay stubs, if you would like to opt out of physical pay stub getting mailed to you please contact your supervisor.
- As a reminder of the yearly pay date shift, employees who are paid monthly will be paid on <u>July 3</u>, rather than June 30. Once we transition to the new fiscal year, we will return to the regular, last-working-day-of-the-month cadence.
- Pursuant to C.R.S. 24-11-101, Governor Polis authorized a governor's holiday for permanent State employees. State offices will be closed Monday, July 3 in addition to the Fourth of July holiday. All permanent State employees will receive eight (8) hours of administrative leave (prorated for part-time) for the governor's holiday. For those individuals on the 4x10 schedule, you will have Friday, June 30 through Tuesday, July 4 off. If you are on the 4x10 schedule, remember the week on June 26 to June 29, you need to reflect you worked 32 hours in that week with a combination of hours worked or use of annual or use of both annual and worked hours. For the week of July 5 through July 7, you must reflect total hours of 24.

His wife egged him on, and he earned an incentive flight in an F-16.

"Passion of aviation drove me; I love flying and it's definitely going to be a career I retire from."

Past Events

Division of Veteran Affairs:

- The State Legislative Session ended on May 8.

Upcoming Events

Division of Veteran Affairs:

- Members of the DVA will attend the National Association of County Veteran Service Officers Training Conference in Madison, Wisconsin, June 4-8.
- Denver DVA will host the 2024 NACVSO Training Conference, June 2-6, 2024.

Civil Air Patrol:

- The Colorado Cadet Summer Encampment will have approximately 100 cadets attending at the USAFA Preparatory School, June 5. Cadets will learn and prepare to lead 120 student cadets that will arrive June 9. The goal of encampment is for the cadets to develop leadership skills; learn about aviation, space and technology; experience a military environment; and live CAP's core values.

CO National Guard:

- Members from the Colorado Air National Guard will participle in German Air Defender, June 1-23. German Air Defender will integrate U.S. and NATO aircraft to role-play in real world scenarios. 26 nations will participate in this exercise.
- Approximately 20 members from the Colorado Air National Guard, including the 140th Communications Flight, 233rd Space Communications Squadron, and 138th Space Control Squadron, will participate in the Cyber Shield Exercise June 2-16.
