ARNG Education Programs and Services

Below is a summary of ARNG Education Programs and Services. ARNG Soldiers should contact their State Education Services Officer (ESO) to learn more about the programs and services they may qualify for.

Federal Tuition Assistance (FTA)

- > Available to currently serving ARNG Soldiers.
- Must complete IADT or BOLC.
- > Pays tuition costs up to \$250 per semester hour, up to 16 semester hours per fiscal year.
- > May be used up to a master's degree and for an academic certificate.
- > Apply through GoArmyEd: <u>www.goarmyed.com</u> and click on "New User" to begin.

Credentialing Assistance (CA) Program

- Must qualify for FTA; may be combined with FTA not to exceed \$4,000 per fiscal year.
- > Pays tuition, books, fees, and examination cost.
- Only Soldiers assigned to the TXARNG and living in Texas are currently eligible under a limited user test (LUT). Program is projected to go Army-wide in FY20.

GI Bill[®] Programs

- > Multiple programs are available depending on your previous military service.
 - o MGIB-SR/Chapter 1606
 - \$384/month for members of the Selected Reserve.
 - Must sign six-year contract, have a high school diploma or GED, and complete IADT or BOLC.
 - REAP/Chapter 1607 IMPORTANT! This program ended for NEW enrollees on 25 Nov 2015 and ends for those currently enrolled on 25 Nov 2019.
 - 80% Rate: \$1,595.20 for two years or more of consecutive active duty.
 - 60% Rate: \$1,196.40 for one-two years of consecutive active duty.
 - 40% Rate: \$ 797.60 for 90 days one year of consecutive active duty.
 - o MGIB-AD/Chapter 30
 - \$1,994.00/month for three or more years of active duty.
 - \$1,595.20/month for two-three years of consecutive active duty.
 - Post-9/11 GI Bill/Chapter 33
 - Payments based on qualifying active duty served/tier percentage.
 - Pays up to 100% tuition and fees at public schools.
 - Pays up to \$23,671 per academic year at for private/foreign schools.
 - Pays a housing stipend equal to BAH at E-5 rate with dependents.
 - Pays a book and supply stipend up to \$1,000 per academic year.
 - Transfer of Education Benefits (TEB)
 - Option to transfer Post-9/11 GI Bill benefits to dependents.
 - Must have served six years and commit to serve four more in the ARNG.
 - Have completed fewer than 16 years of service (effective 12 July 2019)
 - 5 \$350 GI Bill 'Kicker'
 - Available to; Non prior service, prior service and currently serving enlisted Soldiers as well as Soldiers in an officer commissioning program.
 - Must sign a six-year contract or extend to have six years on their contract and meet all other criteria in the current SRIP policy.
