TOUR DESCRIPTION: Serve as a Ground Reconnaissance Observation Member for the Colorado National Guard Counterdrug Task Force. Primary duties consist of providing tactical, operational, and strategic analytical support to various state and federal law enforcement agencies (LEA) with a drug nexus. Ground Reconnaissance members aid in assisting partner agencies with the disruption and dismantling drug trafficking organizations (DTOs) in the fight against illicit drugs and transnational threats to the Homeland.

AREA OF CONSIDERATION: Open statewide, however, this position will be based in the Denver Metro area with no allowance for PCS. Soldiers must meet physical standards IAW AR 40-501.

MILITARY STATUS:

- ADOS Title 32 USC § 502(f)(1)(b)
- This position is a Full Time National Guard Duty (FTNGD) Tour. Selected individual will be on Active Duty Operational Support Tour orders. Tour will be subject to the availability of funds from fiscal year to fiscal year.
- FTNG Counterdrug ADOS Orders are exempt from the 1825-rule.

APPLICANT MUST, AT A MINIMUM, SUBMIT THE FOLLOWING DOCUMENTATION AND MEET ALL APPLICABLE CRITERIA:

- Civilian Resume with signed Cover letter stating why you are interested in the position, and how you will add value to the program along with any letters of recommendation.
- Copy of current valid civilian Colorado driver's license.
- Soldier's Record Brief (SRB)
- All previous DD Form 214s. (Copy must include bottom portion identifying RE Codes)
- Security Clearance verification memorandum from your Personnel Security Manager. Must possess at minimum an interim Secret security clearance.
- DA Form 3349, if applicable. (NO TEMPORARY PROFILES)
- MEDPROS Printout OR verification of current Periodic Health Assessment (PHA).
- Copy of DA Form 705 or AFT Scorecard, reflecting the latest AFT completed within the last 12 months.
- Last two Noncommissioned Officer Evaluation Reports (NCOER).
- Urinalysis testing is required upon entry on active duty and is subject to testing while on active duty.
- Favorable criminal background check is a condition of employment in the CONG Counterdrug Program

FOR AIR FORCE APPLICANTS, SUBMIT THE FOLLOWING DOCUMENTATION AND MEET ALL APPLICABLE CRITERIA:

- Record Review- pulled from vMPF
- All previous DD Form 214s. (Copy must include bottom portion identifying RE Codes)
- Security Clearance verification memorandum from your Personnel Security Manager. Must possess at minimum an interim Secret security clearance.
- AF 469 Duty Limiting Condition Report, if applicable. (NO TEMPORARY PROFILES)
- MEDPROS printout OR Individual Medical Readiness (IMR) status printout
- Copy of current and passing Report of Individual Fitness from myFSS for ANG personnel
- Last two Enlisted Performance Reports (EPR), if applicable
- Urinalysis testing is required upon entry on active duty and is subject to testing while on active duty
- Favorable criminal background check is a condition of employment in the CONG Counterdrug Program

APPLICATION PROCEDURES: Qualified applicants must submit a resume describing military and civilian experience and education along with a copy of the Soldier's SRB OR Airmen's Records Review via email to alex.garza@greeleypd.com and jaclyn.r.byerly.mil@army.mil. The most qualified applicants will be contacted for interviews.

Application must be received at the Counterdrug Office not later than close of business (1700 hours) on the closing date.

PRIMARY DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES (may not be all encompassing):

- Provide temporary fill to CO-JCDTF in order to support to federal, state, local and tribal law enforcement in Colorado. Support law enforcement agencies (LEAs) in daytime and nighttime reconnaissance and observation of LEA suspected drug trafficking operations throughout the state IAW with the Governors State Plan.
- Work effectively in small teams, or as an individual with LEA partners across the state. Display unwavering judgement at all times as a representative of the Counterdrug Program, your M-Day Unit, the CONG, and the military.
- Comprehend and be able to articulate T32 USC 112 and the difference in T10 authorities, most recent DASD CN>'s Counterdrug Guidance, T32 and duty status legal restrictions, Rules for the Use of Force (RUF), CONG and the Counterdrug Program policies and procedures, and Immediate Response Authority (IRA).
- Plan and coordinate mission in accordance with CO-JCDTF policies, which includes developing Operational Plans (OPLANs) and Operational Orders (OPORDs); evaluating all risks and identifying courses of actions to mitigate risks.
- Maintain physical fitness and H/W standards to perform duties.
- Obtain and maintain required weapons qualifications with Counterdrug assigned weapons if allowed to conduct armed operations. Must show proficiency in the weapons system, weapons handling, and safety before being allowed to conduct armed operations.
- Complete all required training including Counterdrug doctrinal and Ground Reconnaissance Phase I prior to performing Ground Reconnaissance missions.

Additional Skills:

- Computer Skills in MS Power Point and Excel. Proficient in oral and written communication, public speaking and must have organizational skills. Fluent in a second language highly encouraged.

Minimum Eligibility Criteria:

Must be a member of the Colorado Army or Air National Guard. Must meet medical standards prescribed by AR 40-501 chapter 2. Must not be a candidate for an elective office, hold a civil office, or be engaged in partisan political activities. Must not be under a current suspension of favorable personnel actions. Individuals who have been separated from other military services for cause, unsuitability, or unfitness for military service are not eligible to enter the Counterdrug program.

The Counterdrug program is NOT an AGR program. Service in the Counterdrug program is "year to year" and subject to the availability of funding. This is an Active Duty Operation Support (ADOS) position (Title 32 USC § 502(f)(1)(b)) and the selected individual will be required by law to attend all unit training assemblies and 15 days of annual training per year while on FTNGDCD. The selected individual must maintain good standing in a unit of the Colorado Army National Guard. Employment in the Counterdrug program is conditional on the continued favorable recommendation of the individual's M-day/traditional unit commander.

PCS and Per Diem funds are not available, member will commute to duty location. Some exceptions may be considered on a case by case basis based on funds availability and regulatory requirements.

Favorable criminal background check is a condition of employment in the CONG Counterdrug Program. Submitting an application to this position implies consent to initiate DMV and criminal background checks on the applicant.

Standards of Conduct: National Guard members participating in the Counterdrug Support Program are required to comply with state laws and with DoD 5500.7-R. They are required to uphold the highest standards of conduct and personal appearance. Outside employment, associations and off-duty conduct/activities must be consistent with federal directives on ethics and with state and federal conflict of interest policies. Outside employment will require written approval of CDC according to para 8-25 of this regulation.

Security Clearance required at SECRET.
