DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

DUTIES and RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Open to members of the 140 SFS.
- This position serves as the senior enlisted leader to the 140 SFS.
- Leads, manages, supervises, and performs force protection duties, including use of deadly force to protect personnel and resources. Protects weapons systems and other resources. Performs air base defense functions contributing to the force protection mission. Controls and secures terrain inside and outside military installations. Defends personnel, equipment, and resources from hostile forces. Operates in various field environments, performs individual, and team patrol movements, both mounted and dismounted, tactical drills, battle procedures, convoys, military operations other than war, antiterrorism duties, and other special duties.
- Operates communications equipment, vehicles, intrusion detection equipment, crew-served weapons, and other special purpose equipment. Applies self-aid buddy care, life saving procedures, including cardiopulmonary resuscitation, as first responder to accident and disaster scenes.
- Provides armed response and controls entry. Detects and reports presence of unauthorized personnel and activities. Implements security reporting and alerting system. Enforces standards of conduct, discipline, and adherence to laws and directives. Directs vehicle and pedestrian traffic. Apprehends and detains suspects. Searches persons and property. Secures crime and incident scenes. Collects, seizes, and preserves evidence. Conducts interviews of witnesses and suspects. Obtains statements and testifies in official judicial proceedings. Responds to disaster and relief operations. Participates in contingencies.
- Develops plans, policies, procedures, and detailed instructions to implement SF programs. Plans, organizes, and schedules SF activities. Provides oversight, guidance, and assistance to commanders with the application of information, personnel, and industrial security programs. Supervises and trains SF personnel and aughtees. Provides on-scene supervision for security forces. Inspects and evaluates effectiveness of SF personnel and activities. Analyzes reports and statistics.
- Leads, manages, supervises, and implements ground weapons training programs. Oversees SF armories. Controls and safeguards arms, ammunition, and equipment. Oversees ground weapons qualification training. Provides guidance on weapons placement to security forces and ground defense force commanders. Controls and operates firing ranges and associated facilities to include supervising construction and rehabilitation.
- Performs other duties as assigned.

DUTIES and RESPONSIBILITIES (Cont'd):

SPECIALTY QUALIFICATIONS:

- Knowledge and experience managing Air Force Security Forces programs and functions including unit manning projections and documents
- Ability to oversee and train subordinate supervisors, deal objectively with workers, render sound supervisory decisions, and plan/organize the work of the assigned squadron in order to meet deadlines in a Total Force environment
