DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

DUTIES and RESPONSIBILITIES:

Under the general direction of the Assistant Chief, the Station Captain supervises firefighting companies in the suppression of fires, emergency medical services, fire prevention, and public education activities. Oversee the maintenance of fire station, equipment, apparatus, and related work as required; coordinates the scheduling of personnel, equipment, training, and work activity; coordinates line functions within administrative policy and does related work as required. Provides fire protection guidance. Executes and enforces the Fire Department Occupational Safety and Health Program. Conducts and evaluates training on specialized fire protection equipment and procedures. Performs inspections and organizational maintenance on fire protection vehicles, equipment and protective clothing. Manages and operates fire alarm communication centers. Supports the electrical power production function with resetting aircraft arresting systems.

Controls and extinguishes aircraft, structure, wildland, and miscellaneous fires. Establishes an emergency operations incident command system. Drives and operates fire apparatus, specialized tools, and equipment. Conducts hose evolutions, pump operations and protects exposures. Preserves and protects emergency scene evidence. Investigate fire to determine origin and cause.

Effects entry into aircraft, structures, and other enclosures. Shut down engines, safeties ejection systems and isolates utilities. Conducts search and rescue operations. Administers emergency first aid.

Knowledge is mandatory of: fire department mission and organization; safety requirements and objectives; fire alarm and communications; fire behavior; portable fire extinguishers; personal protective clothing and equipment; forcible entry, ventilation, ropes, ladders, fire hose appliances, and streams; foam fire streams; fire control, salvage, overhaul, emergency medical care, and cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR); rescue; water supplies and sprinklers; hazardous materials; fire prevention.

DUTIES and RESPONSIBILITIES (Cont'd):

- A. Must be eligible to promote to E-6
- B. Must have a Secret Clearance
- C. Must be willing to attend the required training to meet qualifications
- D. Qualification to operate government vehicles according to AFI 24-301, Vehicle Operations
- E. Must meet physical standards according to DAFMAN 48-123 and National Fire protection Association (NFA) 1582, Standard on Comprehensive Occupational Medical Program for Fire Departments.

SPECIALTY QUALIFICATIONS:

Possesses all DoD Fire Fighter and Driver Operator certifications, with a minimum of Fire Officer II, Fire Instructor I, Fire Inspector I, HAZMAT IC, ICS 300/400. Must be able to obtain Fire Instructor II, Fire Inspector II within 10 months of selection.
