AREA OF CONSIDERATION: This position is open to Army Guardsmen in the grade of E8-E9. E8's will be promotable, or enrolled in the SMA (or equivalent), or having completed the SMA (or equivalent). E9's will be SMA complete, or enrolled. E8 members will be in a promotable status. Soldiers must meet initial eligibility requirements of Table 2-1 AR 135-18. Soldiers must meet physical standards IAW AR 40-501, Chapter 3. ARNG personnel entering sanctuary (18 years Active Federal Service (AFS), but less than 20 years) may be offered tour to achieve 20 years AFS and become eligible for retirement IAW AR 135-200, AFI36-2131 and 10 USC 12686. Retention beyond 20 years AFS on Full-Time National Guard Duty- Counterdrug (FTNGD-CD) will be based on the needs of the State CD Program as determined by the State Counterdrug Coordinator (CDC) and The Adjutant General (TAG). FTNGD-CD orders are fiscal year to fiscal year and are subject to the availability of funds.

APPLICATION PROCEDURES: The documents listed will be submitted AT A MINIMUM to 2LT Adams at peter.n.adams.mil@army.mil and LTC Pelletier at kevin.c.pelletier.mil@army.mil. If any of the required documents are not reasonably available to you, a brief letter will be submitted citing the documents missing with a short explanation necessary to certify the SM is eligible. Failure to do so may result in a finding of ineligibility and may cause the applicant to lose consideration for the position.

1. Last 5 NCOERs/EPRs
2. Current resume displaying military and civilian experience and education
3. NGB Form 23b, RPAM statement
4. Copy of all DD214's/NGB22's showing all prior service
5. Security clearance verification memo (Secret at a minimum)
7. ERB/Record Review
8. Individual Medical Readiness Record (IMR) with last Periodic Health Assessment (PHA) within 12 months of closing date. SM cannot be on temporary profile.
9. Copy of current valid driver's license
10. For ARNG personnel, a copy of a DA705, a current passing AFT score and HT/WT is valid for use as the AFT and HT/WT requirement.
11. DA5500 or 5501-R if applicable.

The selected candidate will be required to submit the following documentation prior to entry in the Counterdrug program:

- Letter of recommendation for Counterdrug duty from unit commander stating soldier is in good standing and is not currently under any type of punitive action to include ongoing investigations, flagged, or under suspension of favorable actions or unfavorable information file.
- Urinalysis testing is required upon entry on active duty and is subject to testing while on active duty.
- Favorable criminal background check is a condition of employment in the CONG Counterdrug Program. Submitting an application to this position implies consent to initiate DMV and criminal background checks on the applicant.

PRIMARY DUTY AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Assist the CDC in directing, administering, and managing the States Counterdrug (CD) program under Title 32 USC 112 authorities.
- Advise the CDC in the validation, acceptance, prioritization, approval, and execution of all CD missions IAW policy, regulations, instructions, and directives.
- Oversee the management and employment of the joint organization of all Airmen and Soldiers including the hiring of FTNG-CD personnel management actions and recommendations.
- Communicate state CD program training, operations, schools, and personnel matters to NGB J3/4/7 and the CONG Joint Staff leadership.
- Enforce compliance of published DASW CN>'s Guidance, CNGBM 3100.01, NGB J3/4/7, and CONG CD program evaluations, and other relevant internal management controls, annual assessments, and self-assessments.
- Ensure all CD members perform only approved CD-Support activities permitted by law, policy, regulation, and instructions, and perform responsibilities within the course and scope of their employment.
- Enforce safety risk mitigation and advise the CDC on employment of additional measures.
- Ensure all CD administrative and mission related data is recorded into the systems of record IAW CD policy.
- Assist the CDC to establish and maintain close working relationships with officials of various law enforcement agencies, drug education coalitions, schools, civic and community groups, as well as state government officials outside of the National Guard.
- Provide program assessment and visibility to the CDC, respond to program needs and requirements to effectively support law enforcement agencies and community based organizations involved in drug interdiction and drug demand reduction activities.
- Assist the CDC in briefing senior military and law enforcement leaders, or members of Congress and their respective staff with or without the CDC. Be able to understand and articulate each CD approved mission and the authorities and policy behind each.

***Note* The SEA may work day to day at a local, state, or federal law enforcement agency, or Task Force based on previous military and civilian experience. This position is not solely a SEA position.**

Additional Skills:

Requires strong interpersonal skills and the ability to excel in a joint and interagency environment. This position will require travel for duties, conferences, and required training. Previous law enforcement, intelligence or Special Operations is desirable, but not a requirement.
