Brigadier General, Director of Joint Staff, Colorado National Guard and G3 (Wartime), 8th Army, US Forces Korea

Brigadier General Scott M. Sherman serves as the Director of Joint Staff, Joint Force Headquarters, Colorado. In this role, BG Sherman directly supervises the Joint Staff and is the commander of the standing Joint Task Force-Centennial, responsible for leading the Colorado National Guard's response to domestic events, as directed by the Governor. Additionally, he directs the Colorado National Guard's specified partnerships, including those with the Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan and the Republic of Slovenia. General Sherman is also dual-hatted as the G3 (Wartime), 8th Army, US Forces Korea. In this role, BG Sherman is the lead US Forces Liaison and Assistant Chief of Staff to the Republic of Korea Ground Operation Command (GOC/GCC). Commanded by a 4-star ROK Army General, the GOC consists of 7 Corps and over 400,000 Soldiers responsible for guarding the Military Demarcation Line, and in times of armed conflict serves as the Ground Component Command under the Combined Forces Command of South Korea and the United States.

BG Sherman is a 1992 graduate of the United States Military Academy and commissioned as a Field Artillery Officer. He served on active duty in numerous operational and staff assignments, primarily in Field Artillery and Operations. Since joining the Colorado Army National Guard in September 2000, Sherman deployed several times, including as the Effects Coordinator for the 25th Infantry Division in Tikrit, Iraq. He has commanded at the Field Artillery Battery, Battalion and Brigade level, and served as the Director of the Joint Staff for the Colorado National Guard where he is responsible for implementing programs for National Guard support to Homeland Security, Defense Support to Civil Authorities and domestic emergency response operations.

BG Sherman earned a BS in Systems Engineering from the United States Military Academy, West Point, NY, and an MBA from Colorado State University. He completed the US Army War College, the Domestic Joint Task Force Commander Course (JCTC), US Northern Command, the Leadership in Homeland Security Course, Harvard Kennedy School Executive Education, and the Dual Status Commander Orientation Course (DSC), US Northern Command, and Senior Leader Development Seminar (SLDS).
