

Chief Warrant Officer 4 Michael L. Coppock

Chief Warrant Officer 4 (CW4) Michael Coppock joined the Army in September 1992. He attended Basic Training at Fort Leonard Wood, MO, and Advanced Individual Training at Fort Sam Houston, TX, eventually being awarded the Military Occupational Specialty 91B, Combat Medical Specialist. Mr. Coppock served in the Regular Army from 1992 – 1997 as a combat medic in the 13th Engineers (Light) at Fort Ord, CA, the 14th Engineers at Fort Lewis, WA and 1/68 Armor at Fort Carson, CO, where he deployed to Kuwait in support of Operation Intrinsic Action in 1995. In November of 2002, Mr.

Coppock joined the Colorado Army National Guard and began his service there as a communications NCO (31U) with the 947th Engineers, as well as a TAC NCO with the Recruit Sustainment Program from 2004-2006. In 2007, Mr. Coppock attended the first Colorado reserve component Warrant Officer Candidate School class.

Mr. Coppock began his Warrant Officer career assigned to the Colorado Army National Guard G6 as the Telecom Manager. In 2009, Mr. Coppock was selected for an Active Guard Reserve (AGR) position within the 169th Field Artillery Brigade to manage and maintain communications assets within the BDE. He deployed with the 169th FAB in 2016-2017 in support of Operation Inherent Resolve and Operation Spartan Shield. While deployed, he was responsible for ensuring reliable communications with several HIMARS firing points and radar locations throughout the theater of operations, including six different countries.

Mr. Coppock is a graduate of Warrant Officer Senior Staff Education, holds a Bachelor of Science degree in Computer Networking from Regis University, and a Master's of Science in Information Technology Management, with a specialization in Cyber Security, from Colorado State University.
